2. Review of city and utility energy use and progress towards 25 x 25 goal – Schieble  
Electricity savings at city facilities was about 18% in 2013 when compared to the average for base years of 2007 to 2009. Renewable energy purchases provide about 26% of the electricity used. All energy efficiency projects focused on electricity saving. The gas usages reflected weather variations. The aquatic center use is strongly related to summer air temperatures.
